

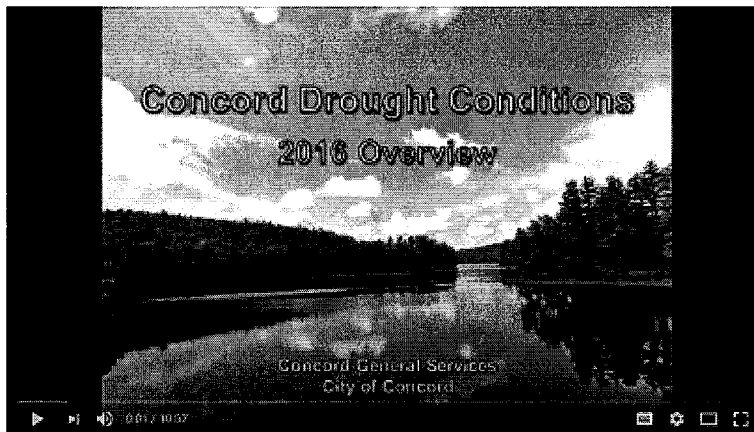

### **CONCORD DROUGHT CONDITIONS PERSIST**

Drought conditions in Concord remain severe. Recent snowfall has helped prevent further drought intensification, but is still not enough precipitation to declare any improvement. Concord received 33.07 inches of precipitation in calendar year 2016. The average annual precipitation is 40.61 inches, leaving a shortfall of 7.54 inches. Water customers should continue to use water wisely. Pool Update – The Board would like to commend those many users who continually shut off lights, hot tub jets, and keep the pool area clean and in a safe, healthy condition. These caring owners and tenants are helping to keep our club house in pristine condition.

However, the Board is noticing an increase of issues using the pool and hot tub especially since the holidays. Lights are being left on for hours throughout the day and night. Children are allowed in the hot tub despite signage to the contrary. Food and drinks of all kinds are being taken into the pool area and found on the floor or seen being spilt in the pool and hot tub. Trash, gum and bandaids are being found in the pool, on the floor and in hot tub filter areas. Non-potty trained individuals are being brought into the pool and hot tub. Swimmers are being used by non-potty trained individuals in the pool and hot tub. Toilets are being plugged and left for others to deal with.

All of the above cause our club house to be less welcoming and unhealthy for all our residents and their guests. The Board requests please read the rules regarding the use of the pool area, posted on the entrance/exit doors and on the walls, prior to using this facility. Let's treat this building as if it were yours, because it is!
